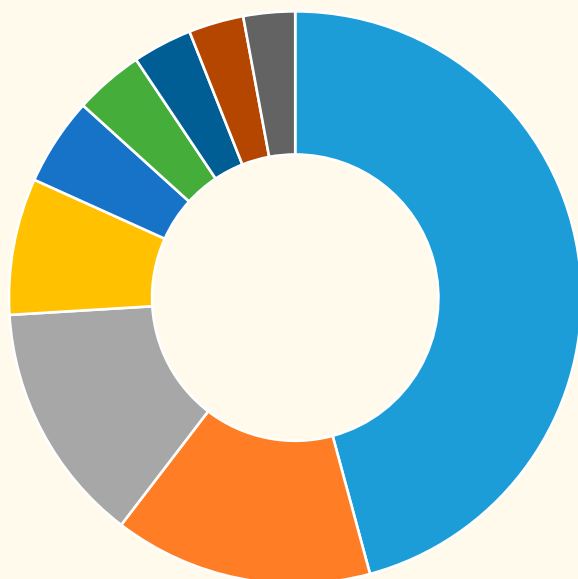
Financials

2025 WAS A RECORD YEAR FOR WOLF HAVEN. Across the nonprofit sector, 2025 brought real headwinds, funding uncertainty, and growing pressure on organizations doing mission-driven work. Our community responded and thanks to your generosity, Wolf Haven raised \$2.6 million last year – the most ever in our history!

That number represents a collective decision, made by nearly 4,000 individuals, to invest in our mission to conserve and protect wolves and their habitat. We are so grateful for the wonderful members of our community who consistently support Wolf Haven's important sanctuary, education, and conservation programs! Because of your generosity, Wolf Haven continues to grow our capacity, our impact, and our resilience. 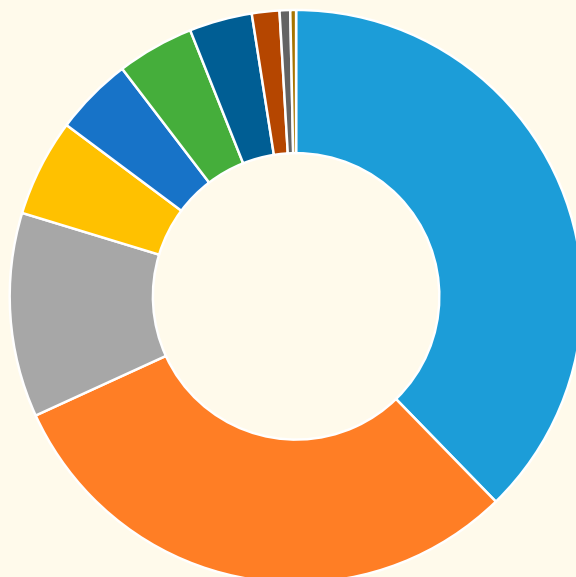
