Continued to build & strengthen exciting new partnerships with local groups and organizations




Financials

We are so thankful for all the wonderful members of our community who consistently support Wolf Haven's important sanctuary, education, and conservation programs! We continue to make exciting updates and upgrades to our development activities, and we anticipate these upgrades will continue to grow our capacity and impact.

One thing you may notice from this financial report is that Wolf Haven's expenses in 2024 were slightly greater than its revenue. Like many organizations, Wolf Haven continues to face rising costs due to inflation for core expenses like animal food, medical care, sanctuary infrastructure repairs, and more. We are working

hard to get this growth in our expenses under control as much as possible, including by identifying more sources of in-kind donations or discounts for critical operational supplies.
